



SAVE YOUR OUTDOOR YARD ITEMS FOR THE COMMUNITY GARDEN "YARD SALE".

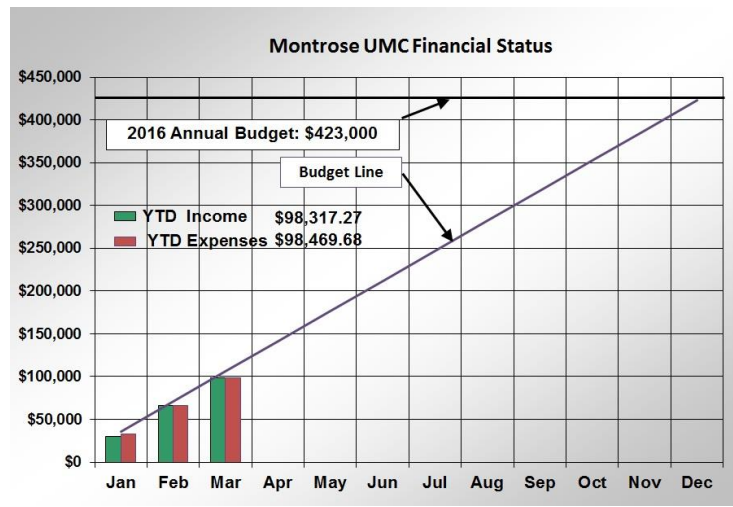
