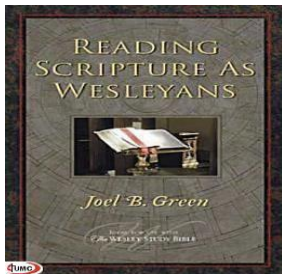
Have you seen the beautiful tableware and other items in the Fellowship area that have been donated for the Roof Fund? Make a bid!! We will not close this auction until the end of October.

Winter Shelter for Homeless

John Harold’s migrant housing building will be used from November 1 to April 30. Utilities, insurance, and damages are the cost. A budget of \$30,000 has been set. The program will be run similar to Delta’s Abraham Connection. The coordinating group is asking for:

- Names of those who would volunteer. Contact would be made and details explained.
- A financial commitment toward the budget. The group will meet on 9/26 to evaluate where they are financially.
- Spiritual involvement and prayer—how we as a church can help, and how those who are working toward this end can clearly hear the voice of the Lord.
