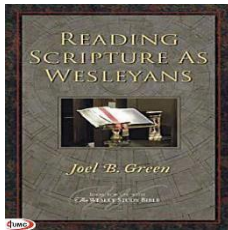
Have you seen the beautiful tableware and other items in the Fellowship area that have been donated for the Roof Fund? Make a bid!!
