Evening Meals at Shepherd's Hand

Shepherd's Hand, leading a partnership with Montrose Jail Ministries and Montrose Lighthouse Ministries is planning to begin evening meal service at MADA next Monday, January 23, initially for the homeless who will be taken to the Olathe shelter after the meal. The meal service will soon thereafter be extended to the whole community.

Additional volunteers will be needed for this expanded ministry that is targeted primarily at our local homeless population.

The new volunteers can serve in two-hour slots on Monday through Saturday: 2:00 - 4:00 p.m., food preparation; 4:00-6:00 food service and cleanup. These volunteers will be able to select the frequency and time of their service, and it could be as little as two hours per week.
