MARK'S MEDITATIONS

Consider the lilies of the field

Not long ago I was talking with my brother-in-law Steve who works for GM (General Motors, now, sometimes called Government Motors) about how we as a culture have gotten into the financial mess that we are in. Steve is very smart, received an MBA from a highly respected University, and has worked in the corporate world for many years. Because of his job at GM he has great insight into individual American's finances as well as governmental and global economies. As he and I talked I ask him how we moved into an economy where so many people and institutions held so much debt. As we talked we discussed things like "debt to whom", "do you think personal, or institutional debt is more important" and "in the end, do you think it is possible to ever pay it all off?" He pointed out things like the average home built in 2005 was approximately twice the size as the average home built before WWII. That seemed impossible to me until we started talking about how few prewar homes had no additions, how they all had one bathroom, no garage, kitchens that are tiny by today's standards. He explained that before 1980 people had one phone per house hold, now Americans have one phone per person, many have texting, plus a land line. Thirty years ago

computers were not part of people's lives, now most American households have more than one, they have also paid for several generations and thrown them away. The homes were so much smaller because Americans did not have microwaves, dishwashers etc. They also own far fewer cars in each family.

As we talked we agreed that all these things are nice (well most, sometimes I would like to back over my cell phone with my car) but they did explain how we got here. How will we get out? We agreed that "indulgence is the down fall of humankind". That getting out would not happen because we were smart as a culture, THAT certainly was not the case. We would not find our way to stability by following the right political party, or because we followed the right person. We would only 'clear' ourselves from this burdensome anchor by following the teachings of Jesus, that is to say knowing that happiness is not uncontrolled spending, or things.

"Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you-you of little faith?"

In the end, we will give up the cell phones, cars, and the rest for our biggest and finest home.

Some changes are coming in the opportunities for missions at MUMC. The Weekend Blessing program is being incorporated into the Shepherd's Hand mission housed out of the MADA building. The Missions Committee has decided that MUMC will not continue to support that mission by providing volunteers on a regular basis. The stipulations for the volunteers at Shepherd's Hand have outgrown the capabilities of our volunteers.

The Missions Committee has learned of another need in our community which the committee feels our volunteers can handle easily. This mission project will be similar to Weekend Blessings in that the volunteers will be making peanut butter sandwiches for sack lunches to be given to the needy students attending the Vista Charter School. The Committee is asking for donations of jars of peanut butter, jelly, granola bars, individual fruit or pudding cups, individually wrapped cookie packages, lunch size bags of chips, and lunch bags. Donations can be left in the boxes which are in the passage way between the sanctuary and Baldrige Hall. We will be phasing out of Weekend Blessings and beginning directly with our own version of Weekend Blessings, which does not have a specific name at this point.

A reminder that the Missions Committee will be making the decision of how to distribute the money from the Darr Memorial at the February 20th meeting. If you would like to have input in that decision, write up a short paragraph and place the information in the Missions Box in the office. The money has been designated to be given to local charitable groups.



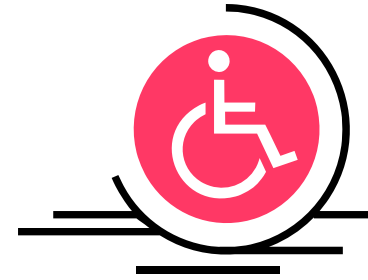
Worship Work Area
Lent and Easter

It seems that we have just put away the last of the Christmas decorations, written our final thank you notes and it is already time to think about Lent and Easter.

Although particulars are still in the talking and planning stage, this is what we know for sure. Ash Wednesday will be Feb. 22. Worship Committee will provide 2012 Lenten devotionals for you to pick up at church. The Lenten study will be Saturday, and conducted by Pastor Mark featuring his trip to the Holy Land (he will have JUST returned!) – the actual time is still in discussion; however, it will not interfere with the 5:30 Saturday evening service. There will be both a Maundy Thursday and Good Friday service in the sanctuary. The Bible reading marathon that continually runs from 8:00 Good Friday evening until 8:30 Easter morning is also still in discussion.

The offering of memorial/honoring potted spring flowers rather than Easter Lilies for the wrought iron Easter tree is also being considered. For several years we had concerns over allergies in connection with the lilies. We have not heard how or if the spring flowers improved on this issue. They certainly were colorful and beautiful. The cost to you will depend on the purchase price that has yet to be determined.

So as you read this, you are aware that much of the upcoming activities are in the “we are unsure and will let you know stage”. What we do know for sure, Christ died for each of us, and His sacrifice has cleansed us of all our transgressions – past, present and future. Praise God! Alleluia Christ has risen!

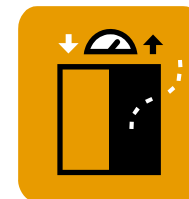

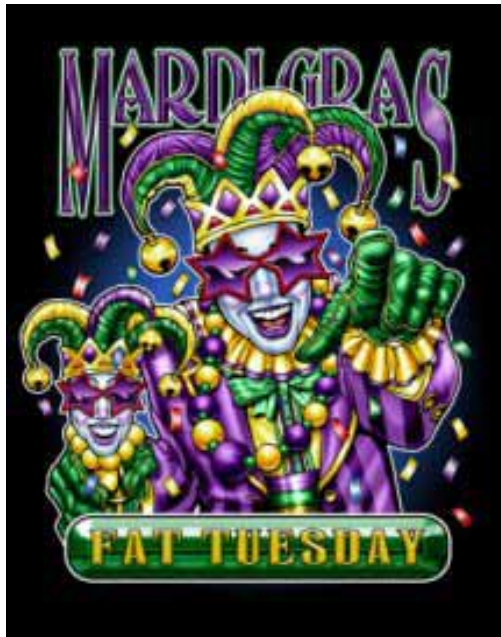
